
COMMUNITY GROUP GUIDE

Gather to Go:: Share the Gospel

Passage: Acts 2:14-41

The Point: The Holy Spirit empowers us to share the Gospel.

Discussion Questions:

- The sermon began by asking how comfortable we are with sharing the gospel. What tends to make you hesitant, fearful, uncomfortable, or timid when it comes to sharing the Gospel? Why?
- Peter went from denying Jesus to boldly preaching Him within about fifty days. What does Peter's transformation teach us about the grace of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit?
- Peter's sermon centers on four movements of the gospel: Jesus' ministry, death, resurrection, and ascension. Which part of the gospel do you naturally emphasize most, and which part do you tend to leave out or underemphasize? Why?
- The crowd was "cut to the heart," and the sermon pointed out that this is the work of the Holy Spirit. Give an example of a moment where you felt "cut to the heart". And How does remembering that conviction belongs to the Spirit and not us change the way we think about evangelism?
- Repentance was described as more than feeling sorry; it is a real change of mind and direction from self and sin to Jesus. How would you explain the difference between remorse and repentance?
- The sermon said, "Speak the gospel and trust the Spirit." What would it look like for you to be more faithful in simply speaking the gospel this week without feeling like you have to control the outcome?
- Peter says the promise is for "you, your children, and all who are far off." Who are the "far off" people in your life right now that may need to hear and see the gospel through you?
- The sermon ended by saying the gospel demands a response. In what ways do you personally need to respond more fully to Jesus right now: through repentance, faith, obedience, baptism, or sharing Him with others?
- What was your biggest takeaway and/or what is one concrete step you sense God inviting you to take this week?
