## COMMUNITY GROUP GUIDE

### Gather to Go: No Other Salvation

Passage: Acts 4:1-12

The Point: The resurrection show us that salvation is only in Jesus.

#### Discussion Questions:

- The sermon raised questions many people ask: Are there multiple ways to heaven? Do all sincere beliefs lead to God? Why do you think those ideas are so appealing in our culture—and even to some Christians?
- Peter’s boldness is striking, especially because he had previously denied Jesus and is now standing before the same leaders who condemned Him. What does Peter’s courage teach us about the transforming power of the Holy Spirit?
- The religious leaders were not mainly offended by morality or good deeds, but by the claim of Jesus and the resurrection. Why is the exclusivity of Jesus so offensive to people, both then and now?
- Peter says Jesus is the rejected stone who became the cornerstone. What does it mean for Jesus to be the cornerstone, and what happens when people try to build their lives on something else?
- The sermon emphasized that all of us naturally turn to “broken cisterns” or false saviors for life, meaning, and security. What are some of the most common false salvations people turn to today and which ones are most tempting for you?
- Acts 4:12 says, “There is salvation in no one else.” How would you explain that statement in a way that is both truthful and compassionate to someone who believes all religions are basically the same?
- The sermon said the gospel demands a response, not just admiration or agreement. What is the difference between knowing about Jesus and actually responding to Him in repentance and faith?
- For those who already know Christ, the sermon ended by saying the response is still the same: keep turning to Jesus. In what area of your life do you most need to freshly turn to Jesus right now instead of looking elsewhere for life or salvation?
- What was your biggest takeaway from the message?
