
COMMUNITY GROUP GUIDE

Everyday:: Everyday Follower

Passage: 2 Corinthians 11:3

The Point: An Everyday Follower is someone who is passionately pursuing a relationship with Jesus.

Discussion Questions:

- **Intro:**

- The sermon contrasted the typical way that we judge success in the church (bodies, budgets, buildings) with personal transformation. How have you personally been tempted to measure spiritual success—either in your own life or in the church?

- **The Distraction**

- Read 2 Corinthians 11:3. Why would the enemy want to distract us from devotion and pursuit of Jesus?
- Paul warns that our thoughts can be “led astray” from sincere and pure devotion to Christ. What does spiritual drifting look like in everyday life?
- Which of the three distractions stood out most to you—and why? (Turning good things into God things, Busyness and hurry and Selfish desires)
- How can good things (family, work, success, hobbies) subtly become competitors with Jesus rather than gifts enjoyed under His lordship?
- Busyness was described as a major enemy of devotion. How can we tell the difference between being faithfully busy and spiritually distracted?
- Louie Giglio said our worship is revealed by the trail of our time, money, energy, and affection. If someone followed that trail in your life right now, what might it reveal about what you value most?

- **The Pursuit**

- Read Philippians 3:7-10. How does Paul describe his pursuit of Jesus?
- The sermon emphasized prioritizing time with Jesus—not out of legalism, but relationship. What has helped you remain consistent with Scripture and prayer in past seasons? What has made it difficult?
- What stirs your affection for Jesus—and are you intentionally making space for those things right now?
- Jesus says we abide in His love through obedience. Is there an area of obedience God has been inviting you into that you’ve been delaying or avoiding?
- Hebrews 12 calls us to “consider Jesus” so we don’t grow weary. What does it look like to pursue Jesus during seasons of dryness, disappointment, or failure rather than pulling away?
- What was your biggest takeaway and/or what is one concrete step you sense God inviting you to take this week?
